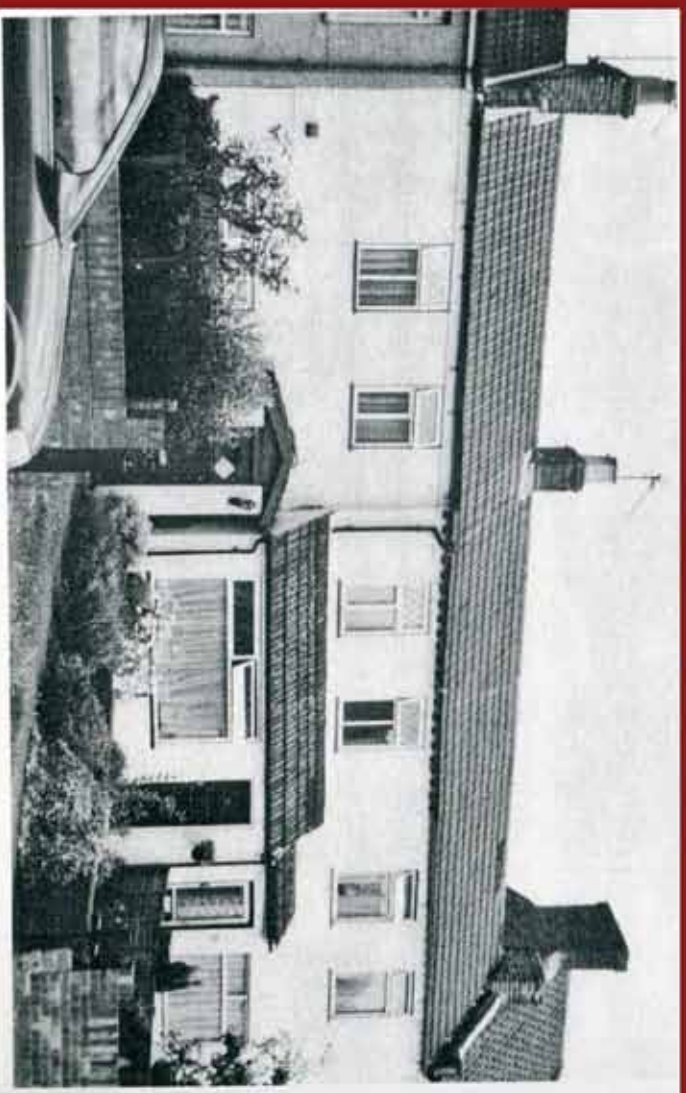

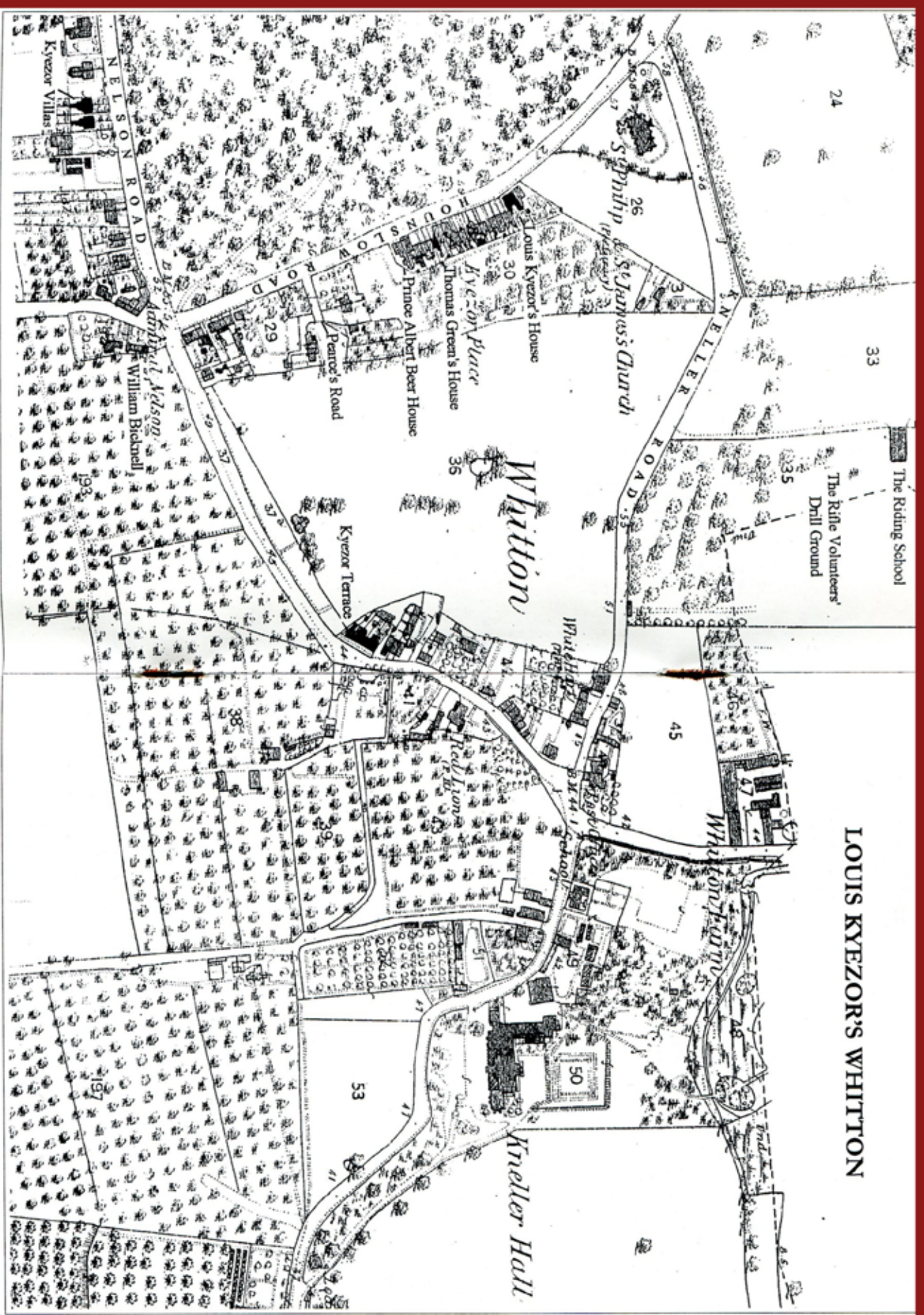

The Rifle Volunteer movement began in 1859, in response to a general perception that the country was open to a foreign invasion. Though this never materialized the Rifle Volunteers Movement continued until 1908, when Haldane’s Army reforms incorporated them into the Territorial Army.”

“This was a serious thing, for none felt safe with a man who could miss the object he aimed at by 15 or 20 feet in a hundred yards; while, on the other hand, Kyezor was too useful a member in getting subscriptions and recruits, to be discharged. 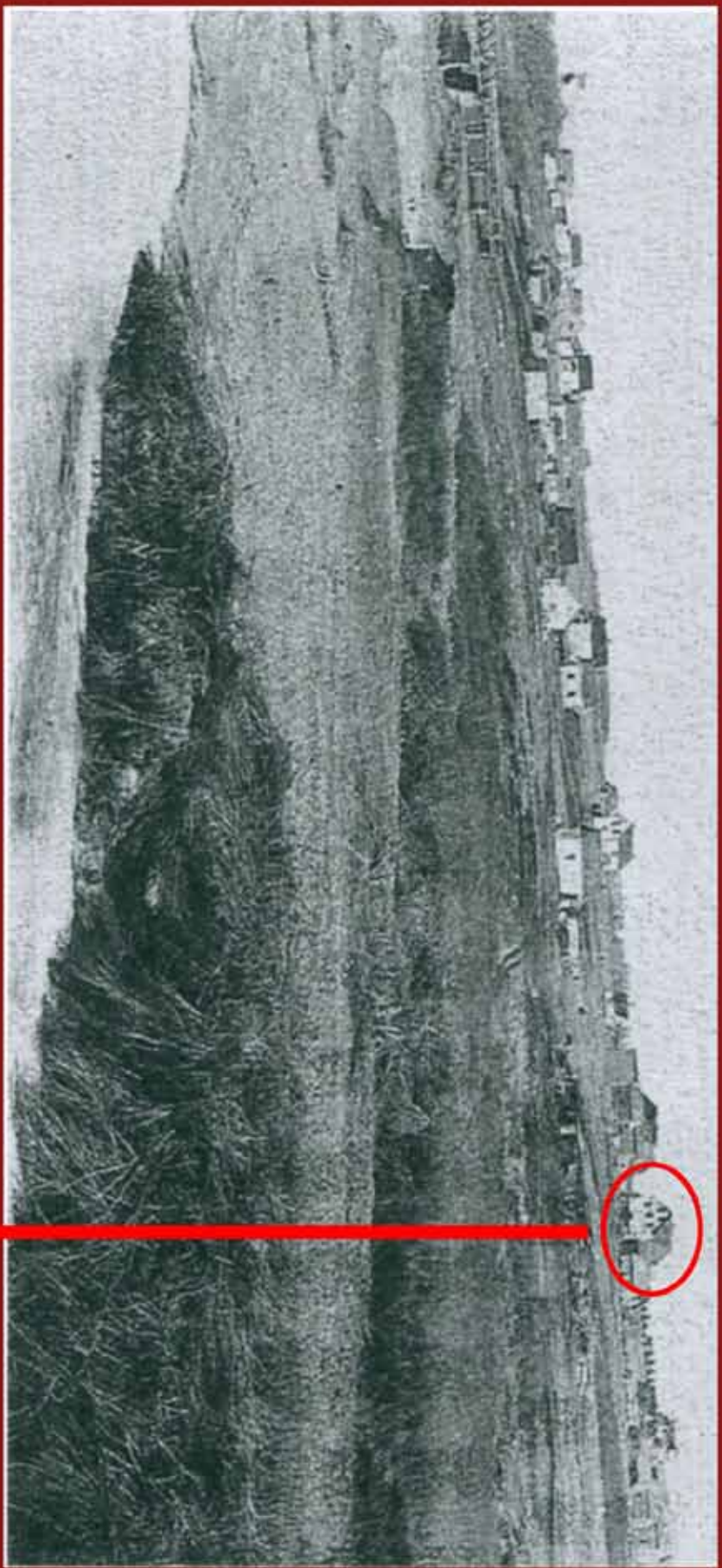

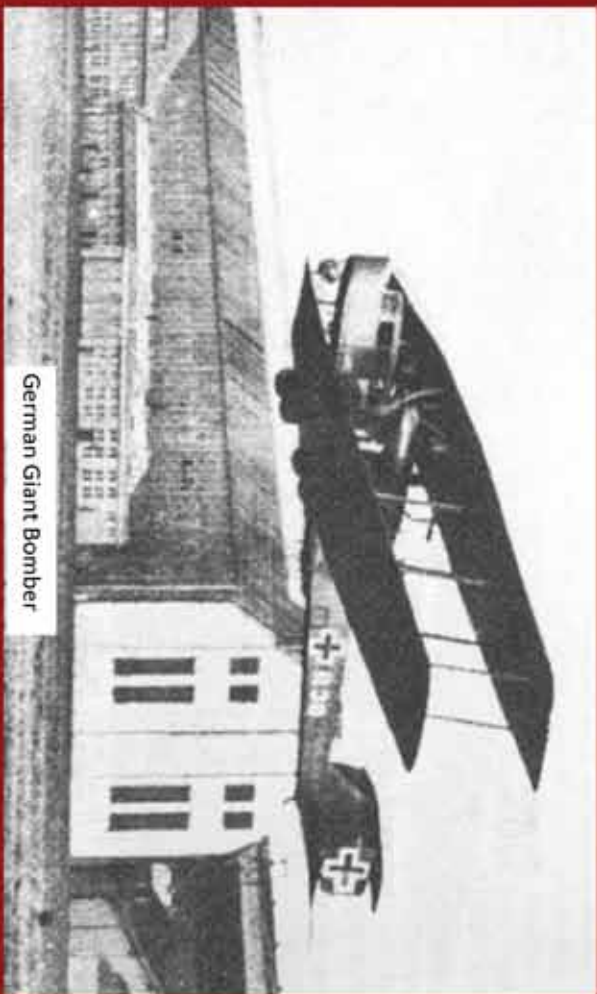

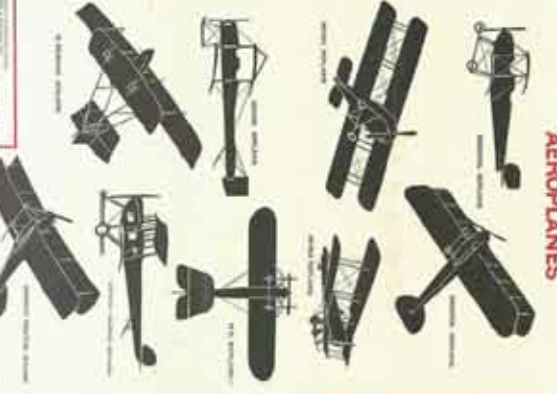
